
# Looking Ahead: Paving the Way for Future Collaboration

# 2025 Korean Business Forum in Bangladesh



## Exploring Synergies for a Stronger Economic Future

The Korean Embassy in Dhaka hosted the “2025 First Half Bangladesh Business Roundtable” on **March 2, 2025, at Crowne Plaza, Gulshan-2**. The event brought together key stakeholders from both Korea and Bangladesh to discuss current political and economic trends, trade relations, infrastructure progress under the interim government, the financial market outlook, and bilateral strategies for growth.

Among the distinguished speakers was **Mr. Shahab Uddin Khan**, President of the **Korea-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce & Industry (KBCCI)**, who delivered a compelling address covering two key areas:

### 1. The Bangladeshi Business Perspective:

Mr. Khan reflected on Bangladesh’s upcoming graduation from LDC status in 2026—a landmark economic milestone. He emphasized the importance of the proposed **Economic Partnership Agreement (EPA)** with Korea, noting it as a vital tool for long-term trade facilitation. He also acknowledged the challenges posed by the country’s transitional political phase, calling for stability and continuity to maintain economic progress.




# Call on Meeting

# Bangladesh-Korea Economy Cooperation

Korea transformed itself into an industrialized economy and became the 15th world's largest economy in the world. South Korea is one of the world's wealthiest nations and is a member of the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) and the G-20 major economies.

Around three decades back, South Korea (Republic of Korea) was a poor country having basically agricultural economy. In fact, during the war with North Korea, it was so difficult for South Korea to have two meals a day. At present the country has changed from a poor country to a donor country, the 12th largest economy of the world.

In the 1980s, South Korea embarked on an economic transformation that would turn it into a global manufacturing powerhouse driven by export-led industrialization, strategic investments, and an increasingly skilled labor force.

South Korea has a significantly larger GDP and a much higher GDP per capita than Bangladesh, reflecting a greater overall economic output and a higher standard of living. In a comparison of the economies of Bangladesh and South Korea, South Korea's economy significantly outpaces Bangladesh's in terms of GDP, GDP per capita, and economic complexity. While Bangladesh has a larger population and a more rapidly growing GDP.

Bangladesh is the 35th largest economy in the world by nominal GDP and 25th largest by purchasing power parity (PPP). It's also the second-largest economy in South Asia. Bangladesh is a lower-middle-income country, ranked 106th richest per capita out of 145 studied.

Korea is a major development partner of Bangladesh since long. South Korea's development assistance has surely contributed to our spectacular socio-economic advancement. The Korean government extending persistent support to Bangladesh through Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA) and Economic Development Cooperation Fund (EDCF) for the development projects in Bangladesh, particularly in priority areas such as health, ICT, education, skills training, water treatment, energy, and transport.

Korea is currently the fourth largest FDI investor in Bangladesh. Korea's investment in manufacturing industries is remarkable in Bangladesh context. Korea's investment is already present in this country. It is the sixth biggest foreign direct investment country for Bangladesh with \$1.3 billion. The investment is very low in comparison to their investment in other countries.

Bangladesh is gradually increasing the export of RMG to Korea. The share remains modest at 4.2% of Korea's total apparel imports. On the other hand, China holds a significant 33.6% share, followed by Vietnam at 31.2% in Korean RMG market. Korea imports RMG products benefits from a bilateral free trade agreement (FTA), and the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP); Vietnam (bilateral FTA, Korea-ASEAN FTA, and RCEP); and Indonesia (bilateral CEPA, Korea-ASEAN FTA, and RCEP).

Among the 200 Korean investment companies in Bangladesh, over 70 percent are in the RMG and textile sector employing over 150,000 Bangladesh workers. South Korea identified footwear and leather, ICT, pharmaceutical, shipbuilding and ship breaking industry, Blue Economy and deep-sea fishing, agricultural and agricultural machinery, greenhouse and carbon trading scheme as new areas of bilateral cooperation.

The proposed Economic partnership Agreement (EPA) between the two countries, if reached, will result in more balanced trade.

There are a lot of challenges for Bangladesh that is needed to be addressed to attract more Korean investments.

- a. A recurring challenge faced by Korean companies is the intricate and unpredictable customs and tax processes in Bangladesh. The complexity not only elevates business costs but also undermines the investment environment, emphasizing the need for a streamlined and business-friendly customs service for improved trade and interactions between the two countries.
- b. The process of extending visas for long-term Korean residents in Bangladesh poses challenges, requiring annual renewals that can take months for government approval. To improve this, streamlining visa extension procedures and reducing processing times would be a valuable recommendation for enhancing the ease of doing business and supporting long-term residents.
- c. Bangladesh should make full use of duty-free and quota-free access to the Korean market. In this regard, the Bangladesh government can actively encourage its companies to make the full use of cash incentives for exporting to the Korean market. As Korea is regarded as the non-traditional market, companies exporting to Korea can get 4% of cash incentives.
- d. Bangladesh needs to make rigorous efforts to increase exports to Korea by sending business delegations to Korea and participating in various exhibitions in Korea.
- e. Simplify the visa procedures, customs clearance, rational tax and tariff policy, repatriation of profit with no holding tax.
- f. Bangladesh should go for FTA with Korea.

Korea is a popular preferred destination for Bangladesh expatriate workers as they can earn the legally guaranteed minimum wage of Korea. These Bangladeshis are said to there were now 10,000 Bangladeshi workers. Some of them are “low and medium” skilled workers were taken through its Employment Permit System (EPS) program. Some of them are informally migrated to Korea. However, we have 1,600 Koreans in Bangladesh and 1,200 are in Dhaka.

# Bangladesh Chamber of Industries

## Meeting

### Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University

On March 4, 2025, H.E. Park Young-sik, Ambassador of the Republic of Korea to Bangladesh, paid a visit to the University of Dhaka and held discussions with Dr. Niaz Ahmed Khan, Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University, and Dr. Mohammad Absar Kamal, Director of the Institute of Modern Languages (IML).

The meeting focused on the potential establishment of a regular Korean Studies course at the university, reflecting growing academic and cultural ties between Korea and Bangladesh. Ambassador Park emphasized Korea's commitment to promoting educational collaboration and language learning.

Ambassador Park also visited the IML campus, where he met with Korean language instructors dispatched by the Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA) and the Korea Foundation (KF). He listened to their experiences and challenges, including the need for improvements in the Korean language proficiency testing system.

The visit underscored Korea's dedication to deepening cultural exchange and supporting Korean language education in Bangladesh.

## Korea to provide USD 6.26 million loan to Bangladesh

Korea will provide a USD 6.26 million loan to Bangladesh under a supplementary agreement in the maritime sector.

In this regard, a supplementary loan agreement on the "Establishment of Global Maritime Distress and Safety System (GMDSS) and Integrated Maritime Navigation System (IMNS)" Project amounting to USD 6.26 million from the Economic Development Cooperation Fund (EDCF) was signed between the government of Bangladesh and the Korea Eximbank.

Mirana Mahrukh, additional secretary of Economic Relations Division (ERD) and Kim Kisang, director general of Korea Eximbank, signed the loan agreement on behalf of the government of Bangladesh and the Korea Eximbank respectively, said an ERD press release.

The Department of Shipping under the Ministry of Shipping will implement the project. Earlier, the main loan agreement amounting to USD 37.50 million for the project was signed between the two sides.

The objectives of this project are to construct coastal radio stations at 7 sites, including lighthouses and to establish transmission links among the command-and-control center including the Department of Shipping Headquarters and 7 coastal radio stations.

Since 1993, on behalf of the Korean Government, the Korea Eximbank has been providing soft loans to various priority development sector projects in Bangladesh. The interest rate of the loan will be 0.01% and the repayment period will be 40.5 years including a grace period of 15.5 years.

# South Korean Businesses set to make significant Investment in Bangladesh

South Korean businesses are set to make significant investments in Bangladesh following the interim government's efforts to create a new era of hope for foreign investors.

A delegation of Korean investors, led by Youngone Corporation Chairman Kihak Sung, made the announcement during a meeting with Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus.

The delegation included officials from LG, as well as representatives from some of Korea's largest companies in textiles, fashion, spinning, logistics, healthcare, power, and renewable energy sectors.

The officials visited the Korean Export Processing Zone (KEPZ) in Chattogram, where several investors committed to immediate investments in the industrial park, which is owned and managed by Youngone Corporation, according to a press release from the chief adviser's office.

During the meeting, Professor Yunus highlighted the government's commitment to reforms aimed at improving the business environment in Bangladesh, including significant changes to labor, industrial, energy, and investment policies.



"We are delighted that you are visiting Bangladesh at a time when we are building a new Bangladesh," the chief adviser said.

"In this new Bangladesh, we have made foreign investment easy and hassle-free. Our job is to make it smooth for you. I know you have undergone some tough times over the past 16 years, and we want to make up for lost time."

Kihak Sung also announced that his company, Youngone Corporation, would establish a textile and fashion college in Chattogram within the next few months to create a talent pool that could help transform Bangladesh into the world's leading textile hub.

He further praised the chief adviser's recent letter to US President Donald Trump regarding tariffs, noting that it addressed concerns caused by the new American administration.

# Could Bangladesh-Korea Bilateral Economic Partnership Agreement be a Gamechanger?

In an exclusive interview with Dhaka Tribune, South Korean Ambassador Park Young-sik discusses why and how Seoul and Dhaka should strive for growth by making additional efforts.

Dhaka Tribune: Bangladesh attached great importance to its relations with the Republic of Korea, a tested and trusted friend and important development partner. Your Excellency, how do you evaluate the current state of relationship between these two countries and how it could be further strengthened in near future?

Ambassador Young-sik: Korea and Bangladesh established diplomatic ties on December 18, 1973. Over the last 5 decades, our two countries have witnessed a remarkable journey of cooperation in various

sectors, including trade, investment, development, and people-to-people exchanges.



Korean companies have been a long-standing partner of Bangladesh, contributing significantly to the growth and success of the RMG industry. In recent years, we have witnessed remarkable developments in diversifying areas of cooperation beyond RMG, particularly in manufacturing and infrastructure.

Korea does not pursue strategic interests beyond our economic cooperation. Over the last fifty years, collaboration in the RMG sector has been a driving force behind our bilateral relations. I believe that the Bilateral EPA, just announced to enter into the negotiation, could serve as the next motor engine to elevate our partnership to new heights in the next fifty years.

Dhaka Tribune: What's the current bilateral business volume and how could we accelerate it further to the fullest potential? Do you think Bangladesh is still able to tap the full benefits of duty free, preferential access to the Korean market?

Ambassador Young-sik: Korea provides preferential market access to approximately 95% of Bangladeshi products under the Asia Pacific Trade Agreement (APTA) and World Trade Organization (WTO) arrangements. However, bilateral trade has not grown since reaching its peak of \$3 billion in 2022. Both countries must make additional efforts to revive and accelerate trade growth.

Bangladesh's export of ready-made garments to Korea is increasing steadily each year. Yet, the current market share of around 5% remains low, highlighting significant potential for expansion. Korea imports these products from China (which benefits from a bilateral free trade agreement – FTA, and the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership – RCEP), Vietnam (bilateral FTA, Korea-ASEAN FTA, and RCEP), and Indonesia (bilateral CEPA, Korea-ASEAN FTA, and RCEP). These countries hold a competitive advantage in the Korean market due to their FTAs with Korea. An economic partnership agreement (EPA) between Korea and Bangladesh could boost Bangladesh's share of Korea's RMG-related imports. On November 28, both countries announced plans to negotiate a bilateral EPA. This agreement aims to go beyond the current Generalized System of Preferences (GSP) benefits, significantly promoting bilateral trade and investment in mutually beneficial ways.

## EPA can boost Bangladesh-Korea Trade

An economic partnership agreement (EPA) between South Korea and Bangladesh can boost bilateral trade, Korean Ambassador to Bangladesh Park Young-sik said, stressing the need for additional efforts by both countries to revive and accelerate trade growth.

It can provide an impetus to increase Bangladesh's share in Korea's ready-made garment (RMG) imports, he said at a discussion with the members of Overseas Correspondents Association of Bangladesh (OCAB) at a local club.

"I believe that the current market share of 5.0 per cent is low and there is further potential to significantly increase this market presence of RMG in Korea," said the Ambassador.

He added that Korea imports RMG products mainly from China, which benefits from a bilateral free trade agreement (FTA), and the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP); Vietnam (bilateral FTA, Korea-ASEAN FTA, and RCEP); and Indonesia (bilateral CEPA, Korea-ASEAN FTA, and RCEP).

These countries hold a competitive advantage in the Korean market due to their FTAs with Korea, he noted. The Korean ambassador was upbeat about Bangladesh's future, saying that Bangladesh has rich human resources and can ask other negotiating countries to expand the movement of professionals in the services sector.



Despite having potential, bilateral trade between Korea and Bangladesh has not grown since reaching its peak at around US\$3.0 billion in 2022, he pointed out. "Bangladesh should focus not just on the quantity, but the quality of its economic growth," he said, adding that the quality of economic growth must be driven by innovation, knowledge and technology areas where foreign companies can make substantial contributions.

The ambassador said Bangladesh needs to boost its manufacturing sector for rapid economic growth. High tariffs on raw materials and intermediate materials should be reduced to promote the domestic manufacturing sector, said the ambassador, adding that Bangladeshi companies are now more engaged in trading rather than in the manufacturing sector.

Talking further on Bangladesh's trade sector, Ambassador Park said there should be expansions in existing sectors such as RMG, jute, footwear, pharmaceuticals and light industrial goods. New items can be added, and trade can also be diverted from other countries due to the FTA that Dhaka is negotiating with South Korea and several other countries, he said.

Stressing the need for bringing in more direct foreign investment, the ambassador said the FDI in Bangladesh is the lowest in terms of the gross domestic product (GDP) at 0.75 per cent as compared to India's 1.7 per cent and Vietnam's 4.7 per cent.


